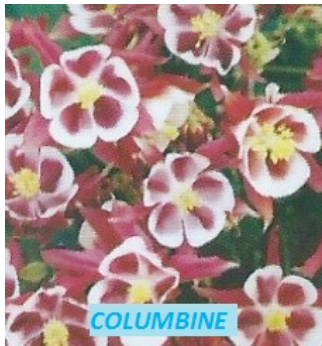


Here's our selection of the Spring perennial dividends for 2016!



Columbine 'Winky Red-White' (*Aquilegia vulgaris*)

Blooms late spring and early summer and grows to 20". Plant in sun to part shade. They are great self-seeders, and the Hummingbird Society lists Aquilegias as one of the best flowers for attracting hummingbirds. We bought only the red-whites, as shown in the picture.

Pyrethrum 'Robinson's Roseum' (*Tanacetum coccineum*)

Blooms June to July and grows to 18-24". Plant in sun or partial sun. This is a long-stemmed Chrysanthemum, a good cutting flower, with possible reblooms, and delicate fern-like leaves. We bought only pink, as shown in the picture.

Blanket Flower (*Gaillardia x grandiflora*)

Blooms early summer through early fall, providing a long season of large daisy-like flowers. Grows 20-24". Plant in full sun. Tolerates heat and drought and even poor soil. We bought a variety of colors, so no promises that you will receive the burgundy color shown in the picture.
